

## Privacy Notice – Cycle Hire Passes Competition

Introduction	Thank you for consenting to take part in our competition or prize draw. This Privacy Notice will explain how we will handle any personal information you provide us.	
Who is collecting your personal data?	The West Midlands Combined Authority (WMCA) is a data controller in terms of the Data Protection Act 2018. (please find our contact details below). We are responsible for managing the information you provide us and we recognise that this information is important to you. We take our responsibilities seriously and use personal data fairly, correctly and safely in line with the UK's data protection laws.	
Your personal data – what is it?	Personal data relates to a living individual who can be identified from that data. Identification can be by the information alone or in conjunction with any other information in the data controller's possession or likely to come into such possession. The processing of personal data is governed by the Data Protection Act 2018.	
How do we process your personal data?	<ul> <li>WMCA complies with its obligations under the Data Protection Act by:</li> <li>Only collecting from you what we are lawfully permitted to;</li> <li>Only using information, we collect in a lawful and fair manner;</li> <li>keeping personal data up to date;</li> </ul>	

	<ul> <li>storing and destroying it securely;</li> <li>not collecting or retaining excessive amounts of data;</li> <li>protecting personal data from loss, misuse, unauthorised access and disclosure;</li> <li>ensuring that appropriate technical measures are in place to protect personal data;</li> <li>ensuring your privacy is lawfully protected.</li> </ul>
Why we need your personal data	We will use your personal data to enable you to participate in our competition or prize draw, publicity, and to notify you if you have won.
What information will we collect?	<ul> <li>We may require from you the following categories of information:</li> <li>Your name;</li> <li>Your contact details;</li> <li>Photos and videos.</li> </ul>
Ways in which we will collect information	<ul> <li>With your consent we may collect information from:</li> <li>Online forms;</li> <li>Face to face interviews;</li> <li>Email communications;</li> <li>Postal communications.</li> </ul>
How the law allows us to use your information?	You have agreed to take part in our competition or prize draw and have provided your consent to use information for this specific purpose. We collect and process this information on the basis of: a) The consent you have provided by taking part in the competition or prize draw; b) our legitimate interests in administering and managing the competition or prize draw.
Who do we share your information with	We will not share your information with anyone outside of the West Midlands Combined Authority (TfWM) except:

	a) Where we have your permission;	
	b) Where we are obliged to either publish or make available information that indicates that a valid award took place	
	c) Where required for any services we are providing you;	
	d) With third parties, external partners, and agencies assisting us under contract in carrying out competitions, prize draws and services we are providing. WMCA will ensure that the third party, external partner, or agency have sufficient systems and procedures in place to prevent the loss or misuse of personal information. Sharing will only take place under strict contractual agreements and/or sharing agreements.	
	Information will only be shared where it is necessary and permitted under the Data Protection Act. Any information shared will be proportionate and limited only to what is necessary.	
What we will do with your information	<ul> <li>When deciding what personal information to collect, use and hold, we are committed to making sure that we:</li> <li>Only collect, hold and use personal information where it is necessary and fair to do so;</li> <li>Keep your personal information secure and safe;</li> <li>Securely dispose of any personal information when it is no longer needed;</li> <li>Be open with you about how we use your information and who we share it with; and</li> <li>Adopt and maintain high standards in handling any personal information</li> </ul>	
How long do we keep your personal information?	In accordance with WMCA Data Retention and Disposal policy your data will be kept for a controlled limited period and no longer than it is necessary.	
What you can do with your information?	Under the Data Protection Act, you as the Data Subject, have the following rights. Each request will be reviewed and actioned wherever possible. However, you should be aware that, due to the reasons that WMCA may be processing your information we may not be able to comply with some requests due to legal obligations. You have the right to:	

Rights	Description

<b>Rectification</b> – You have a right to rectification of inaccurate personal information and to update incomplete personal information	If you believe that any information that we hold about you is inaccurate, you have a right to request that we restrict the processing of that information and rectify the inaccurate personal information.
	Please note that if you request us to restrict processing your information, we may have to suspend any services we provide to you.
<b>Erasure</b> – You have a right to request that we delete your personal information	You may request that we delete your personal information if you believe that:
	<ul> <li>we no longer need to process your information for the purposes for which it was provided;</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>we have requested your permission to process your personal information and you wish to withdraw your consent; or</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>we are not using your information in a lawful manner.</li> </ul>
	Please note that if you request us to restrict processing your information, we may have to suspend the services we provide to you
<b>Restriction</b> – You have a right to request us to restrict the processing of your personal information	<ul><li>You may request us to restrict processing your personal information if you believe that:</li><li>any of the information that we hold about you is</li></ul>
	inaccurate;

	<ul> <li>we no longer need to process your information for the purposes for which it was provided, but you require the information to establish, exercise or defend legal claims; or</li> <li>we are not using your information in a lawful manner.</li> <li>Please note that if you request us to restrict processing your information, we may have to suspend the services we provide to you.</li> </ul>
<b>Portability</b> – You have a right to data portability	Where we have requested your permission to process your personal information or you have provided us with information for the purposes of entering into a contract with us, you have a right to receive the personal information you provided to us in a portable format
<b>Objection</b> – You have a right to object to the processing of your personal information	You have a right to object to us processing your personal information (and to request us to restrict processing) unless we can demonstrate compelling and legitimate grounds for the processing, which may override your own interests, or where we need to process your information to investigate and protect us or others from legal claims. Please note that if you request us to restrict processing your information, we may have to suspend the services we provide to you
Withdraw consent – You have a right to withdraw your consent	Where we rely on your permission to process your personal information, you have a right to withdraw your consent at any time. We will always make it clear where we need your permission to undertake specific processing activities
<b>Lodge complaints</b> – You have a right to lodge a complaint with the regulator.	If you wish to raise a complaint on how we have handled your personal information, you can contact

	our Data Protection Officer who will investigate the matter.We hope that we can address any concerns you may have, but if you remain unhappy you can contact the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO). For more information, visit: <a href="mailto:ico.org.uk">ico.org.uk</a>
